Several of them are set in the small seaside town of Tilling, closely based on Rye, East Sussex, where Benson lived for a number of years and served as mayor. Edward Frederic Benson (1867-1940) was an English novelist, biographer, memoirist, archaeologist and short story writer, known professionally as E.F. Benson. He started his novel writing career in 1893 with the fashionably controversial *Dodo*, which was an instant success, and followed it with a variety of satire and romantic and supernatural melodrama. He repeated the success of *Dodo*, with sequels to this novel, but the greatest success came relatively late in his career with *The Mapp and Lucia* series

consisting of six novels and two short stories. Benson was also known as a writer of atmospheric, oblique, and at times humorous or satirical ghost stories.
